










Suicide And Self-harm


Purposely injured yourself without suicidal intent (e.g., cutting, hitting, burning, hair pulling, etc.)



Seriously considered attempting suicide




Made a suicide attempt




Alcohol And Drug Use


Felt the need to reduce your alcohol or drug use

Used marijuana (within the last 2 weeks)


