Paul F. Williams is Professor of Accounting at North Carolina State University. He earned a B.S. in Forestry at West Virginia University and MBA and Ph.D. degrees from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. His teaching responsibilities include principles, intermediate financial accounting, cost accounting, and governmental/not-for-profit accounting. He has published in a number of scholarly journals including *Critical Perspectives on Accounting*; *Accounting, Organizations and Society*; *Accounting and the Public Interest*; and *The Accounting Review*. He currently serves on the editorial review boards of *Critical Perspectives on Accounting*; *Accounting, Auditing and Accountability Journal*; *Alternative Perspectives on Accounting and Finance*, *Research on Professionalism and Ethics in Accounting*, *Issues in Accounting Education*, and *Accounting Forum*. He serves as Associate Editor of *Critical Perspectives on Accounting*. He is the 2013 recipient of the Accounting Exemplar Award given by the Public Interest Section of the American Accounting Association. He was awarded the Alexander Quarles Holladay Medal by N.C. State in 2016. His service in faculty governance includes serving on the NC State Faculty Senate from 1993-1996, again from 2005- 2009 and from 2011 - 2015. During his terms on the Senate he was a member of the Executive Committee in 1995-96, 2006- 2009, and 2012 - 2015. During those terms he also served as chair of two standing committees, Personnel Policy and Resources and Environment, plus numerous ad-hoc committees including the Faculty Senate Special Select Committee on Reappointment, Promotion and Tenure, Committee to Study the Deans' Review Process, and the Equity Issues Committee. He has served on the Faculty Athletics Council and was Chair of the Faculty Academic Committee of the Council. He also served as an NC State delegate to the Faculty Assembly from 1998-2004 where he chaired the Academic Freedom and Tenure Committee in 2001 and 2002, and from 2014 - present.
