




Academic Progress Rate

- Team-based metric that tracks the eligibility and retention of student-athletes each term.
- How APR is calculated:
 - Each student-athlete receiving athletically related financial aid earns one point for being academically eligible and one point for returning the next term or graduating.
 - A team's total points are divided by points possible and then multiplied by 1,000 to equal the team's Academic Progress Rate.
 - The rolling four-year APR is used to determine accountability.

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 Metric created by the NCAA to measure graduation progress of student-athletes


Includes:

- Reported as a 4-class average





Title IX Status Report

"No person in the United States shall, on the basis of sex, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any education program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance."

Three ways to meet compliance:

- 1 Equity in the ratio of general student body gender composition to sports participation.*
- 2 Demonstrate that needs of the student body are met, i.e. hold open tryouts, survey the students to determine if other sports are desired.
- 3 History of continuing to add sports.*

^{*} NC State has historically used these aspects to show compliance with Title IX.

Attached Roster Analysis
