NCSU Faculty Senate Resources and Environment Committee Meeting November 4, 2021

The committee met to discuss two items.

The first was an "issue of concern" raised by a faculty member concerning the availability of escorts on campus for students, faculty, and staff when they believe it unsafe to walk alone on campus. There seems to have been a decline in the availability of this service since the onset of Covid. The committee drew up a list of questions to present to the police chief Daniel House concerning this issue.

The second issue was about employment and resource allocation trends at NCSU, an issue that has engaged the committee for months. Katharine Stewart (Senior Vice Provost for Faculty and Academic Affairs) met with the committee to discuss how to get the relevant information about trends in compensation and equity for the faculty and administration over the past decade. The committee is interested in collecting more information concerning the headcount of full-time faculty, professional faculty, administrators, and staff and how these have changed over time. The committee is also interested in collecting more information concerning how salaries and other resources have been allocated to these various categories over time. The goal of the committee is to draw up a report to present to the Faculty Senate that lays out this data and probes questions of what the data reveals about the priorities of the administration over the past decade concerning the growth of the university and the allocation of resources.
